

PRIVILEGE CRITERIA

PSYCHIATRIST

Board Certification or Board Eligibility in Adult Psychiatry will meet the criteria for receiving privileges in this category.

A current, valid license issued by the New Mexico Board of Medical Examiners is a required prerequisite to the granting of any privileges.

EDUCATION: Successful completion of an approved psychiatric training program.

EXPERIENCE: As required to complete educational requirements.

See table below for additional requirements per population/service:

Children	Successful completion of an accredited fellowship in Child Psychiatry. OR One year of supervised clinical experience. OR Three years post-training practice experience working with at least 20 children under the age of 12 per year, and 20 CME's in Child Psychiatry.
Adolescent	At least six months of supervised experience working with disturbed adolescents either during residency or post-residency. OR Two years of post-training practice experience working with at least 20 disturbed adolescents per year, plus 12 CME's in Adolescent Psychiatry.
Adult	(See initial education and experience)
Neuropsych Testing	N/A
Substance Abuse	Formal certification in SA/CD by a nationally recognized professional organization OR At least six months of supervised experience working with chemically dependent individuals during or post-residency. OR Two years of practice experience post-training working with at least 20 chemically dependent individuals per year and 20 CME's in Chemical Dependency.
Suboxone	Certification of Suboxone Training AND DEA license for Suboxone Prescribing (# beginning with 'X')

PRIVILEGE CRITERIA

PSYCHOLOGIST- PhD, PsyD

A current, valid license issued by the New Mexico Board of Psychology is a required prerequisite to the granting of any privileges.

EDUCATION: Successful completion of an accredited doctoral program in a Health Service Area with an emphasis in psychology or a doctoral degree in clinical counseling/psychology.

EXPERIENCE: As required to complete educational requirements.

See table below for additional requirements per population/service:

Children	At least six months of full time (or equivalent of) supervised experience working with children under the age of 12 either pre or postdoctoral. OR Two years of practice experience working with at least 20 children per year under the age of 12 post-training and 12 CEU's in the treatment of children.
Adolescent	At least six months of full time (or equivalent of) supervised experience working with disturbed adolescents either pre or postdoctoral. OR Two years of practice experience post-training working with at least 20 disturbed adolescents per year and 12 CEU's in the treatment of Adolescents.
Adult	(See initial education and experience)
Neuropsych Testing	Formal certification in Neuropsychology by a nationally recognized professional organization. OR Either a pre-doctoral internship or postdoctoral fellowship in Clinical Neuropsychology. OR Two years of supervised practice experience utilizing a wide range of psychometric instruments and procedures including the administration, scoring and interpretation of tests to at least ten adult and ten adolescent patients. The ten administrations per age group should represent a variety of diagnostic groups.
Substance Abuse	Formal certification in SA/CD by a nationally recognized professional organization. OR At least six months of supervised experience working with chemically dependent individuals OR Two years of practice experience post-training working with at least 20 chemically dependent individuals per year and 12 CEU's in Chemical Dependency.
Prescriptive Authority	An unrestricted Prescriptive Authority Prescribing Psychologist Certificate issued by the New Mexico Board of Psychologist Examiners and a current DEA or CSR.

PRIVILEGE CRITERIA

PSYCHOTHERAPIST- LISW, LPCC, LMFT

A current, valid license for independent practice issued by the New Mexico Board of Social Work or New Mexico Board of Counseling and Psychotherapy is a required prerequisite to the granting of any privileges.

EDUCATION: Successful completion of an approved master's degree in clinical social work, psychology, counseling or other mental health program including graduate course work and training in psychotherapeutic techniques.

EXPERIENCE: At least two years post-master's supervised experience in a therapeutic environment. This experience must have occurred within the past five years.

See below for additional requirements per population/service:

Children	At least 12 hours of graduate, specialty course work in child/play therapy, child development, and family therapy including a minimum of six months supervised experience. OR Two years of documented, supervised clinical experience post-training working with at least 20 children under the age of 12 per year.
Adolescent	At least 12 hours of graduate course work in family, developmental or adolescent therapy including a minimum of six months supervised experience. OR Two years of documented, supervised clinical experience post-training working with at least 20 disturbed adolescents per year.
Adult	(See initial education and experience)
Neuropsych Testing	N/A
Substance Abuse	Formal certification in SA/CD by a nationally recognized professional organization. OR At least six months supervised experience working with chemically dependent individuals. OR Two years of practice experience post-training working with at least 20 chemically dependent individuals per year and 12 CEU's in Chemical Dependency.

PRIVILEGE CRITERIA

CLINICAL NURSE SPECIALIST (CNS)

A current, valid Registered Nurse license issued by the New Mexico Board of Nursing, successful completion of a national certifying examination in the applicant's area of specialty, and current certification as a Clinical Nurse Specialist by an accredited national nursing organization such as the American Nurses Credentialing Center are required prerequisites for the granting of any privileges.

EDUCATION: Successful completion of a clinical nurse specialist program through an accredited institution of higher education at the master's or doctoral level in a defined clinical nursing specialty in psychiatric nursing or related field and including training in therapeutic techniques,

AND

Is certified by the American Nursing Credentialing Center in Psychiatric and Mental Health Nursing.

EXPERIENCE: At least two years post-master's supervised experience in a therapeutic environment. This experience must have occurred within the past five years.

See table below for additional requirements per population/service:

Children	At least 12 hours of graduate, specialty course work in child/play therapy, child development and family therapy including a minimum of six months supervised experience. OR Two years of documented, supervised clinical experience post-training working with at least 20 children under the age of 12 per year.
Adolescent	At least 12 hours of graduate course work in family, developmental and group therapy including a minimum of six months supervised experience. OR Two years of documented, supervised clinical experience post-training working with at least 20 disturbed adolescents per year.
Adult	(See initial education and experience)
Neuropsych Testing	N/A
Substance Abuse	Formal certification in SA/CD by a nationally recognized professional organization. OR At least six months supervised experience working with chemically dependent individuals OR Two years of practice experience post-training working with at least 20 chemically dependent individuals per year and 12 CEU's in Chemical Dependency.
Prescriptive Authority	Prescriptive Authority authorized by the State of New Mexico Board of Nursing and a current DEA or CSR.

PRIVILEGE CRITERIA

CLINICAL NURSE PRACTITIONER (CNP)

A current, valid Registered Nurse license issued by the New Mexico Board of Nursing, a successful completion of a national certifying examination in the applicant's area of specialty, and current certification as a Clinical Nurse Practitioner by an accredited national nursing organization such as the American Nurses Credentialing Center are required prerequisites for the granting of any privileges.

EDUCATION: Successful completion of a clinical nurse practitioner program through an accredited institution of higher education at the master's or doctoral level in a defined clinical nursing specialty in psychiatric nursing or related field and including training in therapeutic techniques,
AND
 Is certified by the American Nursing Credentialing Center in Psychiatric and Mental Health Nursing.

EXPERIENCE: At least two years post-master's supervised experience in a therapeutic environment. This experience must have occurred within the past five years.

Children	At least 12 hours of graduate, specialty course work in child/play therapy, child development and family therapy including a minimum of six months supervised experience. OR Two years of documented, supervised clinical experience post-training working with at least 20 children under the age of 12 per year.
Adolescent	At least 12 hours of graduate course work in family, developmental and group therapy including a minimum of six months supervised experience. OR Two years of documented, supervised clinical experience post-training working with at least 20 disturbed adolescents per year.

Neuropsych Testing	N/A
Substance Abuse	At least six months supervised experience working with chemically dependent individuals OR Two years of practice experience post-training working with at least 20 chemically dependent individuals per year. OR Formal certification in SA/CD by a nationally recognized professional organization.
Prescriptive Authority	Prescriptive Authority authorized by the State of New Mexico Board of Nursing and a current DEA or CSR.
