

PRIVILEGE CRITERIA FOR ADOLESCENT PRIVILEGES

PSYCHIATRIST

Board Certification or Board Eligibility in Adolescent Psychiatry will meet the criteria for receiving privileges in this category.

A current, valid license issued by the New Mexico Board of Medical Examiners is a required prerequisite to the granting of any privileges.

EDUCATION: Successful completion of an approved psychiatric training program.

EXPERIENCE: At least six months of supervised experience working with disturbed adolescents either during residency or post-residency.

OR

Two years of practice experience post-training working with at least 20 disturbed adolescents per year.

PSYCHOLOGIST

A current, valid license issued by the New Mexico Board of Psychology is a required prerequisite to the granting of any privileges.

EDUCATION: Successful completion of an accredited doctoral program in a Health Service Area with an emphasis in psychology or a doctoral degree in clinical counseling/psychology.

EXPERIENCE: At least six months of full time (or equivalent of) supervised experience working with disturbed adolescents either pre or postdoctoral.

OR

Two years of practice experience post-training working with at least 20 disturbed adolescents per year.

PRIVILEGE CRITERIA FOR ADOLESCENT PRIVILEGES

PSYCHOTHERAPIST: LISW, LPCC, LMFT

A current, valid license for independent practice issued by the New Mexico Board of Social Work or New Mexico Board of Counseling and Psychotherapy is a required prerequisite to the granting of any privileges.

EDUCATION: Successful completion of an approved master's degree in clinical social work, psychology, counseling or other mental health program including graduate course work and training in psychotherapeutic techniques.

EXPERIENCE: At least 12 hours of graduate course work in family, developmental or adolescent therapy including a minimum of six months supervised experience.

OR

Two years of documented, supervised clinical experience post-training working with at least 20 disturbed adolescents per year.

CLINICAL NURSE SPECIALIST

A current, valid Registered Nurse license issued by the New Mexico Board of nursing and current certification as a clinical specialist by an accredited National Organization such as the American Nurses Association is a required prerequisite for the granting of any privileges.

EDUCATION: Successful completion of an approved Master's or Doctoral degree in psychiatric nursing or related field including training in therapeutic techniques.

EXPERIENCE: At least 12 hours of graduate course work in family, developmental and group therapy including a minimum of six months supervised experience.

OR

Two years of documented, supervised clinical experience post-training working with at least 20 disturbed adolescents per year.
